Dear Lakeview Family

This August 29, 2021 will be the 22nd anniversary of when Heather and I, newly married, transitioned from Nashville, Tennessee so that I could go through the second Lakeview pastoral intern program. It was a step of faith for both of us as we were both deeply entrenched in Nashville. It required me resigning from a job I enjoyed; and for Heather, it meant leaving her base of operations as a member of the Christian quartet, Point of Grace. It also meant leaving a church family in Franklin, Tennessee that we dearly loved.

What we learned in that difficult transition is that you cannot out obey the provision of the LORD. The three years we spent at Lakeview were three of the most enriching years of our lives. I had the privilege to be mentored by one of the greatest senior pastors, and pastoral staff, in evangelicalism. Brother Al and his staff poured in to all of us interns in such a way, that when we graduated from the program, we were far better equipped for pastoral ministry than most graduating seminarians. Heather was able to learn from Mrs. Kem and the other staff wives on what faithfulness as a pastor's wife and mother looks like. We also developed life-long friendships here and on August 1, 2002, when we took I85 South out of Auburn to make our way to Louisville, Kentucky, we left behind a beloved church family. We grieved our departure from Lakeview.

But here we are again. You have invited us back; and we could not be more humbled, honored, and grateful. Again, it is a step of faith. We leave behind ministries we love and a church family we adore. The task this time is far more monumental than the responsibility of being a pastoral intern. You have entrusted me with the stewardship task of succeeding my ministry hero, Al Jackson. Yet, this time, I come better equipped with the knowledge I learned in our first tenure here: you cannot out obey the provision of God.

LAKEVIEW HOME SCHOOL ENROLLMENT


