



This Sunday, August 8th, Brother Al and I complete the 7-part series on the great Christological passages of the New Testament. We began our series by looking at Colossians 1:15-20, "Jesus Christ: Supreme Over All Things." We then considered John 1:1-14, "Jesus Christ: Fully God and Fully Man." We followed that text up with Philippians 2:5-11, "Jesus Christ: Lord of Time and Eternity." The fourth text in our series was Matthew 16:13-19, "Jesus Christ: Builder of the Church" followed appropriately by a very important text for the church: 1 Timothy 3:14-16, "Jesus Christ: the Mystery of Godliness." This past week we studied the sixth text of our series, Hebrews 1:1-4, "Jesus Christ: The Radiance of God's Glory." This week, we come to the end of our series with Revelation 5, "Jesus Christ: Worthy of All Worship."

Why would we do this series? Well, ultimately, the title of the Revelation 5 sermon definitively answers that: because Jesus Christ is worthy of all worship. Indeed, "worthy" is a key word in Revelation 5. For example, "worthy is the Lamb who was slain to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!" (Rev 5:12).

But secondary to that, we have considered these glorious Christological texts because the glory of God in Jesus Christ is the only true agent of transformation. Of course we know that progressive sanctification (growth in godliness) is fundamentally an internal, sovereign and supernatural work of the Triune God. But we also know that glorious reality does not cancel our responsibility in the process because the Lord employs "means" in sanctifying us.

And the foundational "means" the LORD uses is found in 2 Corinthians 3:18, "And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the LORD, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the LORD who is the Spirit."

Paul says the glory of the LORD is so powerful, it actually transforms those who simply gaze upon it. In other words, beholding is becoming. Even the Devil knows that. Paul writes just a minute later in 2 Corinthians 4:4 "the god of this world has blinded the minds of unbelievers to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ who is the image of God."

This means to counteract the devil's work, we must determine to behold the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ in corporate worship. Of course, we can behold that glory from any passage in the Scriptures- indeed, we must. Yet, I am so grateful for the LORD's wisdom in giving us these Christological texts that center so succinctly and gloriously on who Christ is and what he came to do. So as we "look to Jesus" (Heb 12:2), this week, we, like Moses, will have our faith strengthened to endure all manner of temptation by "looking to the reward" (Heb 11:26) and "seeing him who is unseen" (Heb 11:27).

HELP WANTED FOREIGN MISSIONS LOCALLY

With the now current and recent COVID-19 situation, foreign mission trips have been almost impossible lately. I met recently with local groups that minister to international AU students and learned that quite a few international students have been accepted at AU and have already obtained the necessary Visa and permission to come to Auburn. I also learned that MANY more students have applied to come to Auburn and are in various stages of obtaining Visas and acceptance at AU. Students are not the only people we are able to minister to through English lessons. There are many, many nationalities here that would love the opportunity to learn English. This increases their ability to live and work more easily here and also to learn what it means to follow Jesus.

Maybe God is calling you to do "At Home Foreign Missions." Lakeview's Conversational English classes will begin again on August 18th and we need teachers, co-teachers, children's workers and other support personnel to make this opportunity possible. Classes will be taught here on Lakeview's campus. We will also begin a new program in which a teacher/mentor and the prospective student will meet one-on-one once per week for one hour at the place they choose. The textbook for this new program is the Bible! What a great opportunity to share the love of Jesus with our international friends and hopefully see them accept Jesus as their personal Savior.
