



Dear Lakeview Family,

As many of you know, on April 1, we are hosting the "Beast Feast" for our men as well as for men in our community. I always treasure those times our men can come together for the purpose of fellowship in the Word of God.

I am especially excited for this particular men's event because one of the most impactful figures in my life happens to be our special guest, Rich Wingo. Rich was the Head Strength and Conditioning Coach at the University of Alabama during my time there. He was the first coach I had ever had who was vocal with his faith. For instance, before each summer workout, he would take us into his office and he would teach us from the Scriptures. Then he would coach us through some of the most difficult and challenging workouts conceivable.

All of this I experienced as an unbeliever. Little did I know that God was at work in my life through the teaching and example of Rich Wingo. He saw his position as a coach as no different as a missionary sees his/her position on the mission field. He was an ambassador for Christ who happened to wear a whistle.

There were many days in those years I wanted to walk away from football. Injuries, disappointments, the twelve month ruthless grind of being a student athlete, all took their toll on me. But God used one man in my life to keep me persevering for four years: Rich Wingo. For whatever reason, Wingo took me under his wing. More importantly, he took me to church. He encouraged me, believed in me, went to bat for me; all the while pushing me physically and mentally to points I never thought I could attain. His expectations for me as a player were sky high; his love and concern for me as a person were even higher.

In fact, he was the first person I called on February 24, 1988 when my grandfather tragically died at the age of 63. We had workouts the next morning and he told me not to worry about those workouts, but to go home and take care of my grieving family. That's what I did.

The following Sunday when I arrived back in Tuscaloosa, I noticed that my name was on the list for "Dawn Patrol." Dawn Patrol was 4:30 a.m. torturous workouts for guys who were in serious trouble for missing curfew, skipping class, or something even worse. Well, that angered me and I marched in his office and in a heightened volume, I asked, "Why is my name on the list for Dawn Patrol? I've been home for a funeral!" Rich replied, "You missed workouts." I responded back with an even louder voice, "You told me to. You told me to go home and take care of my family. That's what I did." Then he replied, "BP, you've missed the point. You are making it up."

I didn't speak to him for three months after that. I was so angry. Looking back, I am overcome with gratitude for what he did. He expected so much from me. He demanded much. He knew I was a relatively average athlete compared to the guys I was competing with and so he pushed me to limits beyond my imagination. He made me tougher. I grew up under his leadership.

But the most important thing he did was give me the gospel. He gave it to me through his words and through his example. I never heard him use a curse word. I saw him treat Derek Thomas, an All-American and future NFL Hall of Famer, the same way he treated the player on the end of the bench. He treated us as image bearers who all needed Jesus; and he gave us Jesus.

And largely through his massive influence, I was eventually converted to Christ. Now I have the privilege to introduce him to the men I now pastor. You do not want to miss hearing from him. You do not want other men you know to miss it either. Please make every effort to be with us on April 1. And until then, please pray that God uses Rich Wingo as mightily on that evening as he used him in my life.
