



Dear Lakeview Family

As all of you know, the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ is not just taught or preached one Sunday per year in faithful churches like Lakeview. It is taught, preached, and believed every week in every true and faithful church of our Lord Jesus Christ. Indeed, as the Apostle Paul asserts, the death of Christ for our sins, his burial, and his resurrection "on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures," is the message of "first importance" (1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

That is why, as Douglas O'Donnell so eloquently states it, *The resurrection of Jesus Christ is being preached every Sunday in Caracas and Cairo, Moscow and Madrid, Dakar and Dublin, Buenos Aires and Baghdad, Santiago de Cuba and Seoul, Melbourne and Montreal, Bangalore and Belgrade, Reno and Rio de Janeiro. Magna est veritas et praevalebit* (great is the truth, and it will prevail).

Yet in God's good and wise providence, there is one Sunday per year a high majority of the unchurched world pauses, and ponders the claims and significance of Jesus Christ raised from the dead. And though the significance of Jesus' resurrection is too great to recount in an article, just consider, on Resurrection morning, God was able again to say what he had explained over his creation so many centuries earlier, "It is good. It is very good."

Indeed, the Resurrection is God's promise of a new world given in advance while we live in the old world. That is, Jesus Christ is the "firstborn from the dead" (Colossians 1:18). Our future resurrection is entirely dependent upon his resurrection. Jesus is the "firstfruits" of those who have fallen asleep (1 Corinthians 15:20, 23). This expression "firstfruits" (cf. Romans 8:23) secures for us two hopeful guarantees. First, the guarantee of more to come. That is, Jesus' resurrection guarantees the resurrection of his people (see 1 Corinthians 15:14-18). Second, it guarantees the quality of what is to


follow. Jesus' resurrection provides the *pattern* for our resurrection (see Philippians 3:21).

To celebrate this glorious reality that Jesus indeed is risen, we will be gathering on Sunday at 6:15 a.m. for a sunrise service (outside between the porticos on the parking lot side of the church building). Immediately following that service, our Carpenters for Christ are graciously cooking and serving us breakfast in the Fellowship Hall.

One thing to note, there *will be no required cost* for the meal. With that said, a basket will be provided for any who may want to help offset the cost of the breakfast. Please join us; invite your friends, family, neighbors, and co-workers. Then after breakfast, we will have our normally scheduled Sunday School hour at 9:30 and worship service at 10:45. There will be no evening service this week. Please be in prayer for Sunday, not just for Lakeview but for all churches across the world as the gospel of Jesus crucified and raised from the grave is proclaimed.

One final note, thank you for your sacrificial giving to Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. We have currently given \$54,700.20. You are a giving people. That is clear evidence of grace (2 Corinthians 8:1-4). I am encouraged by that as well as excited to see how much Lakeview can contribute to this crucial offering to our North American Mission Board.

We praise God for the freedom we have to meet openly in buildings, to advertise our services publicly, and to worship Jesus our King loudly and without fear. The additional comforts, freedoms and programs included in the version of church that we experience here do not make it inherently better or worse than church elsewhere, but what if all of that were stripped away?

What if all we had was the Word of God and nothing else? No band, no large building, no church staff, no children's programming, no youth or college or... anything else. But we had the WORD.

Would it be enough?

This is the question that led David Platt (pastor, author, and former IMB President) to start something called "Secret Church," an in-depth one-night study focused on nothing but the Bible and how it comes to bear on our lives.
