Dear Lakeview,

As most of you know, for many years, Brother Al led a "preaching class" on Tuesday mornings and many men have been deeply impacted by that class, including myself. On Tuesday morning, August 30, at 6:30 am, we will be resuming that class.

I invite any and all men to come to the class, whether you sense a special call to preach and pastor or not. Prayerfully, we will have a good representation of college guys as well who may be sensing that God could be calling them to the gospel ministry.

The book we will be using, both in the fall and the spring, is a book written by long time pastor Albert N. Martin, titled, "The Man of God, His Preaching and Teaching Labors." The book is volume two of a 3-volume work Pastor Martin wrote entitled "Pastoral Theology."

Pastor Martin is retired pastor of Trinity Baptist Church in Montville, NJ where he pastored for 46 years. At his church, they had a ministers' training program called the Trinity Ministerial Academy for 20 years where he taught all the Pastoral Theology courses (of which the content is now found in his 3-volume Pastoral Theology work).

My favorite anecdote of Pastor Martin that speaks to his gravity in the pulpit comes from Pastor Edward Donnelly who described an amazing scene, which occurred at a family conference in the summer of 1990 at Williams Jennings Bryan College. Donnelly writes: *The main auditorium was filled with six or seven hundred people and he was preaching on Jesus in Gethsemane. Towards the close of his sermon, all the lights went out and Pastor Martin finished preaching in the dark. As he led in prayer at the end, the lights came on again. It was discovered that the building was equipped with a motion sensor system for switching off the lighting when there was no one in the auditorium. The large audience had been so gripped by the preaching that there was, literally, not a single movement among them. The engineers had not calculated that it would be possible for people to sit so motionless and the instruments were calibrated accordingly. When Pastor Martin had announced the closing prayer, we must have leaned forward in our seats and triggered the lighting. It was a startling example of the power of the Word!*

Pastor Martin reminds me a great deal of Brother Al. Pastor Martin never sought a large platform. He simply and faithfully preached to, and pastored his people for over four decades and poured his life into future ministers of the gospel. Sounds familiar does it not?

That is why I have chosen his book on preaching for us to read and discuss. I am hoping a strong group of men from college age and older will commit to spending time with me in room 208 starting at 6:30 am on Tuesday, August 30. You never know what God might do in your life through discussions like these. If you are interested, please contact Mrs. Gretchen Hood in my office. She has ordered the books for the discussion. I hope to see you there.
