Also, consider dropping him a note and expressing to him how much of a blessing he has been to you over the last twenty years. I am sure that testimony could be multiplied in the thousands. On another note, it is that time of year again where I will be teaching the four-week Children's Catechism class. The dates will be February 6, 13, 20, and 27th from 4:00 pm -5:00 PM in Room W208-209 (children's department).

For those of you unfamiliar with the term, catechism (from the Greek word catechesis) is simply instruction in the core doctrines of the Christian faith. Instead of replacing the role of the Bible in Christian education, catechisms done rightly serve as the basis for it. The study of catechisms have been helpfully compared to looking at the box top of a jig-saw puzzle before one starts to put all of those hundreds of little pieces together. It is very important to look at the big picture and have it clearly in mind, so that we do not get endlessly sidetracked by some unimportant or secondary issue.

The theological categories given to us through good catechisms, help clarify the innumerable details found in the Scriptures themselves. In other words, a good catechism serves as a guide to better understanding Scripture. That being noted however, we need to remind ourselves that Protestants have always argued that catechisms are authoritative only to the extent that they faithfully reflect the teaching of Scripture. This means that the use of catechisms do not minimize or remove the role of Scripture. Instead, catechisms, as summary statements of what the Holy Scriptures themselves teach about a particular doctrine, serve as a kind of springboard to more effective Bible study.

Studying catechisms also serves as an important safeguard against heresy and helps to minimize some of the problems associated with the private interpretation of Scripture. How many times have you sat through a Bible study in which the goal was not to discover what the text actually says, but instead to discover what a particular verse means to each of the studies' participants? When we recognize that virtually every Christian cult began with an open Bible and a gifted leader who could ensure his followers that they alone have discovered what everyone else have missed, we see maybe the greatest benefit of catechism.

So to summarize, catechism helps us to discern the central doctrines of the faith. Additionally, this helps us understand the Scriptures better. Finally, they help guard against false doctrine (heresey). These are some of the reasons why we see the need to teach our young people at Lakeview a catechism. Children should have a parent, grandparent, or guardian present, and the child needs a Bible. I hope to see you there.

Last, but not least, as of this past Sunday, January 29, you have given \$249,126 to the Lottie Moon Christmas offering. This is a generous amount and I am grateful for your sacrificial giving. With that said, it is a significantly smaller amount than last year and I want us all to prayerfully consider that the International Mission Board's future plans and strategy to reach the unreached peoples of the world will require churches to increase their giving in order for this strategy to be implemented.
