Students will experience a comprehensive Language Arts program that includes not only writing and literature, but also spelling, grammar, and vocabulary. The writing program used is *WriteShop, Jr.* The WriteShop curriculum is “flexible and creative. It will engage the interest of both enthusiastic and reluctant writers! With hands-on, interactive lessons, children will practice all types of writing, including creative, expository, narrative, and persuasive essays. They’ll learn brainstorming, drafting, editing, and revision skills, and also how to choose vivid, descriptive words and vary their sentences in order to build strong paragraphs.” The WriteShop curriculum also includes lessons in grammar. Students are expected to complete weekly writing assignments. Additionally, students will read classic novels each month and complete reading comprehension activities. Tests and grades will be given on writing, literature, spelling, and vocabulary throughout each semester.

Allison graduated from Auburn University in 2003 with a B.S. in Early Childhood Education. After graduation, she worked for over 3 years at Women’s Hope Medical Clinic training volunteers and planning fundraising events. She then taught 4K preschool at Lakeview Preschool Adventures for 3 years, before transitioning home to take care of her two children.
