Dear Lakeview Family,

As you know, one of many signs that a local church is healthy is that the preschool department is thriving and flourishing. Indeed a strong church preschool department reflects that a church has strong married couples who are not only committed to family life, but family life centered around church life.

With that said, our Lakeview family is booming in our Preschool Department. We have one toddler Sunday School class (ages 2-3) that is growing weekly. That is such a blessing from the Lord. But you do know what that means? With growth in toddlers, there is a corresponding need for teachers who are called to love and lead them. In fact, we need two teachers for our toddlers as soon as possible. As well, our "Mission Friends" are exploding. This ministry to ages 3-5 meets on Wednesdays from 6:00-7:00 PM. We are in great need of teachers for the three-year-old class. In addition to that need, during worship hours, we need several additional volunteers to serve in the nursery (the more we have, the larger the rotation can be).

Now the instinctive response might be, "what good is there for me to even come to church if I have to work the nursery during corporate worship?" To be clear, I have never heard that reasoning from anyone at Lakeview, but I raise that hypothetical question to offer you this thought: The New Testament, though certainly not denying the importance of our individual walks with God, emphasizes that our Christian lives are to be lived out in the community of the local church. Just consider how the Epistles were written to churches; Hebrews was likely a sermon to a church, and Revelation was written to seven churches. Or note the number of times the phrases "each other" and "one another" are found in our New Testament. These phrases do not address our relationship to God (though that is fundamental and prerequisite) or a relationship to oneself. Neither do they speak of a relationship with the universal church. Rather, they address interpersonal relationships within a local church.

So for example, 1 Peter 1:22 "love *one another* earnestly from a pure heart." Galatians 5:13 "through love serve *one another*." Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind to *one another*." 1 Thessalonians 5:11 "encourage *one another* and build *one another* up." Hebrews 10:24 "Let us consider how to stir up *one another* to love and good works." 1 Peter 5:5 "Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward *one another*." And perhaps the most important of these "one another" texts for my purposes in this letter: 1 Corinthians 12:24 "God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it, there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for *one another*."

What these verses, and many more, drive home to us is that when I'm not present and serving in the church body, not only am I short-changing myself, I'm cheating others in the body who need my "one-another" ministry to them. But it also means that I must sacrifice my preferences at times so that others may receive the "one-another" ministry that I need myself.

These aforementioned "one-another" texts are just a sample but each of them could be obeyed in part by investing in our Preschool ministry. If the Lord is laying this ministry burden on your heart, please contact our Preschool Director, Joan Moreman or her assistant, Marie Foshee.

One last thing along these same lines, Jennifer Vail, our Children's Director (grades 1-6), is in need of help as well. You can see more about that in her column this week. But how humbling it is that our great God would entrust us, with so many wonderful children in our preschool and children's ministry. Not only are the children and their parents a blessing to us, but it also gives us opportunity to "one another" each other. God is good all the time.
