



Dear Lakeview Family,

I know you, like me, have been grieving and praying, while outraged, as we continue to hear of the moral atrocities committed against the nation of Israel that began on Saturday morning by Hamas. Thankfully, we have an opportunity to put feet to our prayers. As many of you know, we have "boots on the ground" in Israel with our own Lakeview couple, V and C who we providentially commissioned three weeks ago. (Please pray for V and C, their ministry on the ground as well as their protection.) They have presented to us a very tangible way to help financially through our own IMB, so that families in need can be housed, fed, and helped in many other ways.

To contribute directly to Baptist Village relief efforts, open the Camp and Conference Center link: https://www.imb.org/give/project/camp-conference-center-team/, scroll down to the Scholarships. Enter the amount and the funds will be used for present relief needs in Israel: housing tents, security needs, volunteer and displaced persons expenses, food, supplies etc.

On a more positive note, a few weeks ago, our brother Kris Mobbs, told me about a 29 year-old believer in Uganda named Aggrey Ongaya. He shared with me that in all his years in Uganda, Aggrey stood out above everyone with regard to spiritual maturity, knowledge of Scripture, a gentle spirit, and a servant's heart. He said that Aggrey just needs an opportunity for formal training so that he could adequately pastor and train other pastors in Uganda.

So, thinking that the pastoral internship might be exactly what Aggrey needs, three weeks ago, Kris and I set up a time for me to meet Aggrey via Zoom. I was immediately struck by his humility and his hunger to learn, grow, and be better equipped for the gospel ministry. I came away extremely excited as to the possibilities of Lakeview and staff, as well as the The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (SBTS), being able to invest in him.

Aggrey, for his part, is completely on board. Although he has never been in another country outside of Uganda, he has applied for and received a passport, and applied for and been approved at SBTS. He has the flexibility to come to us because he is still single.

Of course, at this point, he still needs to be approved by the church and I do not want to assume anything. With that said, if approved, we need to get ahead of things by finding him a place to live. Aggrey does not have many financial resources and so his need is that God would raise up someone at Lakeview who would be willing to graciously house him.

It would be a tremendous investment in a young man of God who has a clear calling on his life. As you well know, opening our homes to saints and strangers who come into the assembly is an important part of Christian living. Peter exhorted, "Show hospitality to one another without grumbling" (1 Peter 4:9). Hebrews says, "Let brotherly love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares" (Hebrews 13:1-2). Paul writes, "Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality" (Rom 12:13).

If you are willing to pray about this, and are so led to invest in this young man, please let us know. His arrival here would likely be sometime in mid to late November. Thank you for your consideration.
