Happy New Year Lakeview Family,

I hope that you all had a joyful Christmas season and that 2024 is off to what will be a fruitful year. I would like to kick off our year by directing your attention to a very important ministry of Lakeview that many in our body may not yet know enough about, our "In His Hands" ministry, which is a ministry centered on our special needs image bearers. The theme verse for this ministry is 1 Corinthians 12:22 "the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable." To that, we say, "amen."

Ryan Faulk, of Joni and Friends ministry, published an article in February 2020 with a title that should burden us all: "The Largest Unreached Group You've Never Heard Of." The article begins with these grievous words, "Without anyone even realizing it, a huge number of people with disabilities have been locked or pushed out of the church."

Thankfully, the Great Commission to the unreached peoples of the world is increasingly gaining traction as the Word of God and sound theology is being restored in evangelical churches across the country. Yet as the article laments, "But today, one of the largest unreached groups of people in the world has been artificially created by the church. Without anyone realizing it, a huge number of people with disabilities have been locked out or pushed out of the church."

Indeed, numerous studies reveal that, all things being equal, people with disabilities are less likely than their peers to attend church even once a month. It is estimated that there are 61 million American adults who live with some sort of disability and there are about 2.25 million who could be attending church, but do not. A 2018 study from Clemson reveals that children with any kind of disability are less likely than their peers to attend church, and children with autism are nearly twice as likely to never attend a religious service. Of course, that, in turn, impacts the families of the disabled who may desire to attend but cannot because of caring for their loved one.

Faulk closes his article with these words: If Christ thought it was worth going to the cross to win the hearts of people with disabilities, what efforts should we make to include them in the Body of Christ? That church that can look at anyone who comes through their doors and confidently say, "You are not only welcome here, but wanted" is a church with a powerful prophetic witness But because the world is, by default, a poor fit for people with disabilities, the church is also a poor fit, unless we intentionally include the people of all abilities.

In our city alone, parents of children with a disability have to inordinately lean on the school system for help. I am grateful for the school system, but these families need more than physical or material help. They also need spiritual help and that is the church's role. Our county has 159,913 people in it with 20,733 of them with disabilities. So the harvest is plentiful. But, the laborers are too few.

In 2024, we desire to help correct that by relaunching our "In His Hands" ministry. So starting on January 7th and extending to February 4th, we will have three tables in the lobby with information on this ministry. You can also find a page for this ministry on our website. We will conclude with a new volunteer training on February 4th at 4:30 with our local Joni and Friends representative.

No individual member at Lakeview is called to every ministry. But every member is called to ministry at Lakeview. As you are praying for wisdom and discernment as to how the Lord could use you in 2024, I can say there would be no more strategic way to employ your spiritual gifts than in this important ministry. Matthew 25:40 And the King will answer them, "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these..., you did it to me." As you pray about your role with "In His Hands," pray as well for this ministry.


