**COURSE DESCRIPTION.** Get ready to explore all things "green and growing". From the anatomy of a tiny seed, to the tops of the Giant Sequoias, we will learn "why Botany matters". Your student(s) will discover the fascinating inner workings of a flower through dissecting to identify various parts; observing and participating in the pollination process; and growing their own flower to attract birds, butterflies, and bees.
