Dear Lakeview Family,

I have been reading Jim David, Michael Graham, and Ryan Burge's recent book, "The Great Dechurching," which shows the outcome of an extensive research project centered on whom they call the "dechurched," defined as someone who used to go to church at least once per month but now goes less than once a year.

Their study shows that in the United States, we are presently seeing the largest and fastest religious shift in the history of our country, as tens of millions of formerly regular Christian worshipers nationwide no longer attend church at all. Approximately 40 million adults in the US today used to go to church but longer do, which accounts for 16 percent of our adult population. In fact, for the first time in the eight decades that Gallup has tracked American religious membership, more adults in the US do not attend church than attend church. This has largely transpired in the last twenty-five years. One startling point is that more people have left the church in the last twenty-five years than all the new people who became Christians from the First Great Awakening, Second Great Awakening, and Billy Graham crusades combined.

Now, there is a variety of reasons for this. For instance, our culture has become less accommodating and even hostile to the Christian faith. That would obviously have an influence on those who are more "nominal" with regard to their faith. Some moved to a new city but never took the initiative to find a church. The rise of children and youth's sports on Sunday has also played a major factor. Then others stopped attending church during Covid-19 and so developed new Sunday routines and rhythms that they now prefer over Sunday morning corporate worship. Others experienced genuine pain in their church that led them to lose hope in the institution of the church. Still others went through family changes like divorce or remarriage and it made the church feel uncomfortable.

But I would like to offer you one aspect of this research that we should find encouraging. "Dechurched evangelicals" are still largely orthodox in their faith. Sixty-eight percent still believe in the Trinity; 64% believe in the divinity of Jesus; 65% believe Jesus' death on the cross and paid the penalty for the sins of those who believe in him; 67% believe in the resurrection; 62% believe that Jesus is the only way to God and 61% believe that the Bible is reliable for all matters of faith and practice.

And here I come to my main point. When asked how willing these "dechurched evangelicals" would be to return to church, 51% said they are either somewhat willing or very willing. The takeaway: many "dechurched evangelicals" simply need a friend to invite them to church. For hundreds of thousands of dechurched evangelical Christians, all they need is a personal invitation. In fact, the authors gave their early research to a Presbyterian church called The Crossing in Columbia, Missouri, and they began initiatives to engage this group of people. They identified "dechurched evangelicals" and in just a matter of months, they had 120 formerly dechurched people worshiping with them in person.

In other words, the "Great Dechurching" is reversible, and should not be and does not have to be the final word for the dechurched. Ask the Lord to direct you to those who were once in church, but are now dechurched. Then commit to do something very loving. Invite them to Lakeview. God does great things through small acts of obedience. Andrew Bonar once said, "A holy life is made (Pastor's Pen continued on next page)

up of a number of small things: little words, not eloquent speeches or sermons; little deeds, not miracles or battles; not one great heroic act or mighty martyrdom, make up the true Christian life. The little constant sunbeams, not the lightning...are the true symbols of a holy life." We often miss the great by overlooking the little. That little act of inviting a dechurched image bearer to church may just have a multigenerational impact on that person. And it will, in turn, have a significant impact on your personal walk and the vibrancy of the church.
