Dear Lakeview Family,

We began our journey in the Gospel of John during Advent Season 2021. This past Sunday, April 28th, we completed our time in that glorious document.

This coming Sunday, we begin our study of Paul's Letter to the Colossians, which was written between A.D. 58-62. As a brief overview, Colossians has four chapters, 95 verses. The first half of the letter (chapters 1-2) is a theological treatise that gives us one of the most profound statements in all of Scripture on the person of Christ. The second half of the letter (chapters 3-4) is a power packed mini ethics course, addressing virtually every area of the Christian life by the Christology we read of in chapters 1-2.

The Apostle Paul's purpose in writing it is really threefold: (1) to assert the all-sufficiency of Christ, (2) to correct specific false doctrines and practices on the basis of the sufficiency of Christ, and (3) to encourage believers in practical living on the basis of that sufficiency. This makes Colossians the most explicit statement in the Bible about the all-sufficiency of Christ. Jesus is sufficient to fill all spiritual longing and needs, so that we have no need of anything beyond Christ's person and work to make our salvation complete and to experience the fullness of God. And if Christ is truly supreme and sufficient, our love for him should be absolute. That is, if we were as devoted to Christ as we ought to be, our behavior (as given in the second half of Colossians) will take care of itself.

So as we make our way through this inspired letter, pray that it will lead us by the Holy Spirit to praise our God and Father through our Lord Jesus Christ. Indeed, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving (Colossian 2:6-7).

Daily I have been reminded that the Rock upon which I stand is Christ. Apart from Him I can do nothing.
