



Dear Lakeview Family,

We are coming off a glorious weekend where we celebrated Good Friday and Resurrection Sunday. One of the emphases in our worship services was that the Resurrection matters most centrally because Jesus' death was a substitutionary atonement.

As was said, one of the most important words in the New Testament in driving home Jesus' substitutionary sacrifice is the preposition "for" $(\dot{v}\pi\dot{\epsilon}\varrho, \text{ hyper [sounds like uper]})$. This preposition means "on behalf of" or "in place of" and so connotes both representation and substitution. In other words, Jesus gave his flesh and blood on behalf of sinners, so at the first Lord's Supper, Jesus took bread, broke it, and said, "This is my body given for you." Jesus took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, "This is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you."

So the Resurrection is the great event that confirms that Christ's substitutionary sacrifice is sufficient for everyone who believes. That said, this is where I would like to offer a couple of other small words that are so critical to the gospel, *ephapax* and its related term *hapax*.

Given the news that Pope Francis died on Monday, it is helpful to know as people of the great Reformation, these words have a good claim to being the spark that ignited the Reformation in France. In October 1534, placards were posted all over France attacking the Roman Catholic Mass, using Hebrews 7:27, "He has no need, like those high priests, to offer sacrifices daily, first for his own sins and then for those of the people, since he did this once for all when he offered up himself." The words "once for all" is the word "ephapax" $(\dot{\epsilon}\phi\dot{\alpha}\pi\alpha\xi)$ in Greek (see also Romans 6:10; Hebrews 7:27; 9:12; 10:10).

Similarly, the New Testament writers employed the word "hapax." So Peter writes that "Christ also suffered once (hapax) for sins" (1 Peter 3:18). This adverb is used to describe the singularity and finality of what is found in Christ (see also Hebrews 10:1-2).

The point is that "if Christ's sacrifice for sin on the cross was a complete work, and thus neither need be, nor can be repeated, then are our attempts to atone for sin must be both unnecessary and insulting to Christ, in that they (the Roman Catholic Church) suggest his work is not sufficient." (Michael Reeves, *The Unquenchable Flame*, 98). That is, if Christ's sacrificial work "for" us is indeed "once for all," then there can be no need for other priests or high priests to offer up more.

So three small and seemingly insignificant words—hyper, ephapax, and hapax—help to illuminate to us all how glorious, singular, and all-sufficient the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ really is. That is why Charles Wesley served us so well in these words one of his glorious hymns:

Tis finished! The Messiah dies, Cut off for sins, but not his own; Completed is the sacrifice, The great redeeming work is done. Tis finished! All the debt is paid; Justice divine is satisfied, The grand and full atonement made; God for a guilty world has died.

We can only hope that Pope Francis came around to believing that.


