



Dear Lakeview Family,

Over the last couple of weeks, we have discussed the tongue (a metaphor for our use of "words"). We have considered that the tongue does what the heart has already done. That is, out of the heart, the mouth speaks (Matthew 12:34-35).

Last week, in response to the message on James 3:1-12, one of our godly men came to me and shared with me the challenge of refraining from gossip when your boss is involved. Of course, that is a sensitive situation, but I told this friend that this would be a helpful discussion to consider.

So what does this look like in those situations where someone who has authority over you encourages you to engage in gossip? Well, let us employ Ephesians 4:29 as our anchor text. "Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those hear."

Clearly, this text forbids all forms of gossip and only allows for timely words that edify. With that anchor verse in mind, let me offer these suggestions when faced with the possibility of gossiping.

(1) Do not say anything. Proverbs 10:19 "When words are many, transgression is not lacking, but whoever restrains his lips is prudent." The exceptions would be in the case of someone being significantly harmed by keeping a secret.

(2) Praise what is praiseworthy. That means giving encouragement, commendation, and affirming words where it is appropriate. Commendation can sap the life out of gossip. Again, Paul says to speak "only such as is good for building up."

(3) Never about, always to. These words come from Amy Carmichael, missionary to India in the early 20th century. The idea is that conflicts are fueled when we talk about people rather than to them. Is not that the principle of Matthew 18:15 "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault?"

(4) Be a conduit of mercy. Proverbs 10:21 "The lips of the righteous feed many." We do not have to say everything we think. Indeed, we can be merciful because our heavenly Father is merciful (Luke 6:36). This may include offering a charitable counter perspective to the words of gossip you are hearing.

(5) Flee. Proverbs 20:19 "Do not associate with a simple babbler." As much as you can, stay away from situations and settings where you know gossip is taking place.

(6) Cover. Proverbs 17:9 "Whoever covers an offense seeks love." If there is a word that is the antonym to gossip, it is to cover. Again, Proverbs 10:12 "Love covers all offenses." Let me qualify this. Sin must be confronted, not covered. If there is abuse, there should be no covering of that. It does mean taking pains so that those who are not part of the problem or part of the solution, do not hear. It also means defending someone's reputation when you know the chatter is not rightly representing the truth. It may also mean having the conviction and courage to tell the "gossiper" that it is not any of our business or that we need to apply the Golden Rule. Sometimes covering may also mean asking the "gossiper" if they have gone to the person being discussed.

These are some thoughts to consider. It is in no way exhaustive. I am sure you could add to this list. If we applied these biblical principles, I do believe God's glory would be more magnified in our conversations.

One last unrelated topic before I close. This Sunday is our last Sunday to take up the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. Currently we have received \$71,259.11. If you have not given but are planning to, now is the time. I am so grateful for your sacrificial giving for the sake of our Lord Jesus and out of obedience to his Great Commission command.


