



Dear Lakeview Family,

I hope that our study in the Epistle of James has benefited you as much as it has me. Please pray for me as we begin our study of Galatians, an epistle that is made up of six chapters (149 verses).

During the Apostle Paul's first missionary journey with Barnabus (AD 47-48), they visited several places, including the island of Cyprus, the region of Pamphylia and Pisidia (which included a visit to Antioch Pisidia), and three cities in South Galatia: Iconium, Lystra, and Derbe. They then returned home to Antioch in Syria (Acts 14:26).

Paul and Barnabus spent a good deal of time in Antioch; however, at some point, people came from Judea and taught that Gentiles must be circumcised to complete their conversion to Christianity. They did not deny that you must believe in Jesus for salvation, but they stressed that you must be circumcised and keep the law as well. In other words, "you must let Moses finish what Christ has begun" (John Stott). Paul and Barnabus had a debate with this group known as the "Judaizers." They all went to Jerusalem to discuss the issue with the apostles and elders there (Acts 15:1-2).

Galatians was probably written just before Paul left for the Jerusalem council in AD 49. If this is correct, it is likely that Galatians is the first letter Paul ever wrote. Paul sent this letter to the churches he and Barnabus had planted in South Galatia during their first missionary journey (including Iconium, Lystra, and Derbe), to ensure that they did not turn away from the gospel of grace that was preached to them (Galatians 1:6).

Indeed, the central and dominating burden of the epistle is to defend God's free grace in the gospel. The central question of Galatians is, "What is humanity's problem that Judaism and the Mosaic Law cannot fix?" One of the keys to understanding Galatians is to consider the contrast between the old and new covenants, two different eras in salvation history.

Let me close this short background summary of Galatians by presenting to you the key doctrines in the letter: justification by faith alone, the Holy Spirit, adoption, and redemption. Perhaps the main point of Galatians could be summed up in this way - Christians are free from the bondage of the law, which comes through faith in Jesus Christ.

Please be in prayer for me as I prepare these sermons from Galatians over the next few months.
