Dear Lakeview Family,

On May 14-15, 2010, I attended Dr. Harry Reeder's "Embers to a Flame" conference hosted here at Lakeview. In the providence of God, I was about to preach my first sermon as the new pastor at First Baptist Church Fisherville, in Louisville, Kentucky. That conference was so very important because the emphasis was on church revitalization, the very calling God had for me at my new church.

At the conference, Dr. Reeder handed out a prayer from *The Valley of Vision*, titled, "A Minister's Preaching." It is a prayer that resonates with me, one that I have memorized, and have prayed in the first person most every Sunday since that weekend.

Today, I would like to offer you that same prayer, but from the congregation's perspective. I know many of you already pray for me. It is deeply encouraging to me and I am so very humbled and grateful for your prayers. There are few things that reveal to me my need for prayer more than preaching weekly.

If you are led, would you would pray this for me, or whoever may be preaching that day? There is nothing magical or sacramental about this prayer, but I do believe the petitions in this prayer resonate with the desires of every gospel preacher.

"My pastor is desired to preach today, but he goes weak and needy to his task; yet he longs that people might be edified with divine truth, that an honest testimony might be borne for You; give him assistance in preaching and prayer, with heart uplifted for grace and unction.

Present to his view things pertinent to his subject, with fullness of matter and clarity of thought, proper expressions, fluency, fervency, a feeling sense of the things he preaches, and grace to apply them to men's consciences.

Keep him conscious all the while of his defects, and let him not gloat in pride over his performance.

Help him to offer a testimony for You, and to leave sinners inexcusable in neglecting Your mercy.

Give him freedom to open the sorrow of Your people, and to set before them comforting considerations.

Attend with power the truth preached, and awaken the attention of his slothful audience.

May Your people be refreshed, melted, convicted, comforted, and help him to use the strongest arguments drawn from Christ's incarnation and sufferings, that men might be made holy.

He himself needs Your support, comfort, strength, holiness, that he might be a pure channel of Your grace, and be able to do something for You; give him then refreshment among Your people, and help him not to treat excellent matter in a defective way, or bear a broken testimony to so worthy a Redeemer, or be harsh in treating of Christ's death, its design and end, from lack of warmth and fervency.

And keep him in turn with You as he does this work."
